Regional Artists Cleo Clark Williams and Ray Muniak in New Exhibits

A Sense of Place: The Paintings of Cleo Clark Williams and Saved from the Fire Pit: Wood Sculpture from Environmental Debris Artist Ray Muniak are on display now through February 29, 2004 in the galleries of the Museum.

Canton's Cleo Clark Williams attended the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts and Kent State University, earning a Bachelor of Fine Arts in 1982. She then began to showcase her art and in 1978, won her first award at the Lithopolous, Ohio Open Competitive Exhibition, earning the title "Best-of-Show." Since then, Cleo has been a part of numerous exhibits all over the United States, including California, Florida, New York and Pennsylvania. In addition to participating in nearly forty shows, Cleo has also taken home numerous awards, and not surprisingly, has been featured in *American Artist Magazine* twice. In addition to Cleo's exhibitions, her work can also be seen around Ohio, at businesses, banks and hospitals.

Hinkley's Ray Muniak has been working with wood for over forty years, creating "Muniart" wall hangings and sculptures. Initially, Muniak was "inspired by my father working with wood and the wonderful aroma of fresh-

We owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to the many volunteers who helped to make this a success, especially the two co-chairs, Gloria Rayburn and Sue Bratton, who seemed to be everywhere at once! What amazed me most about these two is that every time I ran into them at the Markt, they began telling me about new ideas for next year's Christkindl Markt!

As we approach the end of the year, it seems appropriate for the Trustees and Staff to express our thanks to all of our volunteers, friends, patrons, members, sponsors, for helping in so many different ways to assure the success of another CMA season. We can all look back with pride on a number of wonderful exhibitions and special events, such as our Ohio Bicentennial exhibits, *In a Clear Light* and *Turkey River*, and their popular opening receptions. Certainly of paramount significance was the installation of the Jerry Peart Sculpture on the campus of the Cultural Center for the Arts, and featured in the December issue of *Sculpture* magazine.

Next year has the promise of a few surprises, one or two "experimental" projects, and one of the most important exhibitions we've ever attempted: *Andrew Wyeth: The Helga Paintings*. The Canton Museum of Art will be the next-to-the-last venue in the United States for this collection before it goes to a new home overseas. World class exhibitions come with heavy fees, and so all of us—Trustees and Staff—will be exploring every possible funding resource.

And as we approach the end of the year, this is the perfect time to examine worthy projects in the arts for tax-deductible donations. Here's are a few items on our Holiday wish list: the Andrew Wyeth exhibition has a six-figure rental fee, and although some portion of this expense will be realized through admissions, the CMA must pay for it up front. We'd like to adapt the CMA library somewhat to serve as a conference room, with new tables, chairs, and a PowerPoint system. Your gift, small or large, would help us meet these challenges—and make things a little easier for you when April 15 rolls around. You may have some ideas of your own about a specific funding project. In any case, we are ready to respond to your inquiries, or to meet with you and respond to any questions and concerns.

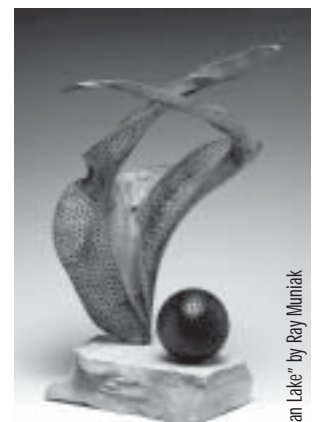

cut pine." A full-time artist since 1987, Ray moved to the rural area of Hinckley to create his artwork from home and construct a personal gallery. He has been involved with over thirty exhibits and gallery shows, including ten years at the Yankee Peddler Festival in Canal Fulton, Ohio, where he was named 2001 "Artist Craftsman of the Year."

When asked about his creative process, Ray states, "each piece of cast-off wood has within itself a hidden form that I am first unaware of. As I work the piece and remove the decayed areas, it speaks to me, guiding me in different directions. The focus of my art is to create objects of beauty that is both calming and mentally titillating."

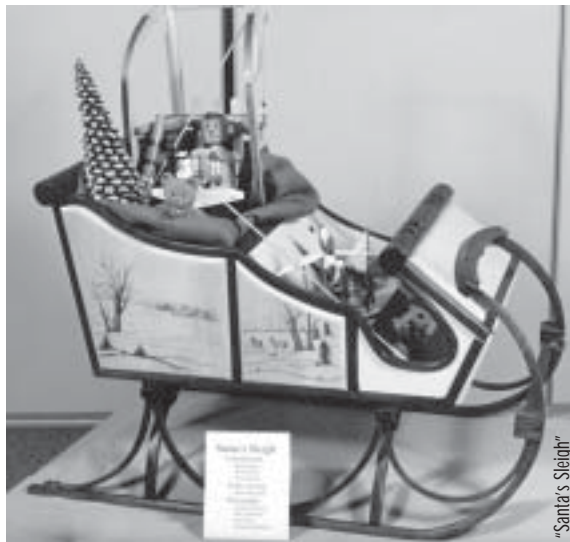
CMA Docents
