Engaging Art Classes for the Stark County Military Community, Focused on Creative Self-Expression and Community Connection

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: (June 25, 2025, Canton, OH) — The Canton Museum of Art (CMA) is proud to announce that it is one of 48 organizations across the U.S. that were awarded a Creative Forces Community Engagement Grant, part of the Creative Forces[®]: NEA Military Healing Arts Network. The grant supports community-based arts projects that aim to address the experiences, challenges, and strengths of our military communities at all levels – active duty to veteran.

CMA's Community Engagement Grant will support the Museum's Alpha-Romeo-Tango (ART) Program, now in its second year providing healing, engaging benefits of artmaking to the Stark County military community. Led by artist/teaching artist and military spouse, Susan Mentrak, the ART Program is offered free and in collaboration with allied

The focus of ART is a 10-week series of art classes, both Fall and Winter sessions, for hand-building clay creations and culminating in a community celebration at the Museum. Participants get to experiment and express themselves through their own art, share their stories, and connect with each other and the greater community – with the benefits of increasing well-being and building resilience.

Related programming with Pegasus Farm's Military and First Responders Center (M&FRC) will include "Day of Clay" workshops, as well as "Art & Creative Writing" and "Art & Music" events, in which participants of all ages can express themselves creatively. These are presented in collaboration with M&FRC, Mentrak, and CMA's Education Director, Amanda Crowe.

CMA Director & CEO Max Barton II said, "The ART Program aligns directly with our mission to make art and its inspiration accessible and meaningful for all. The program uses the creative process for participants to be inspired, relax, create, and have a finished work of art to reflect upon with pride.

"ART's clay classes allow participants to feel connected, like they belong to a larger community — and through art, to feel like they can share their stories. It's all about self-expression, pride, and connectedness. We are proud to serve those who serve us."

The partnership with artist Mentrak and with the M&FRC creates an impactful new collaboration for CMA, extending the Museum's reach and effectively combining services to provide meaningful experiences of art(s) not previously available for military populations in our local community.

One veteran participant from CMA's 2024-25 ART Program summed it up: "I had no clue on how to construct and make something with clay, I now feel fairly confident with the techniques I learned. I found working with the clay so relaxing and meditative. I have a creative side I love tapping into."

Barton said, "The purpose of our ART Program aligns precisely with the Creative Forces Community Engagement Grant Program objectives to 'promote the health, well-being, and overall quality of life of military-connected individuals by understanding their needs and providing access to community arts experiences."
