1. This piece is tall and sort of abstract but the welded metal is neatly stacked. The artist was a teacher in a town nearby. I bet you can find this piece if you try!

2. Steel was part of what built Canton, and surrounding cities like Cleveland and Akron. The man in this picture worked with the metal while it was hotter than water from a fresh tea kettle.

3. This machine is a space age invention, like something from the cartoon, "The Jetsons." It hovers just above the floor while making your home a mess no more.

4. Design is important for selling products and artists are part of the process. One of the images in this section features a wedding dress!

5. Another stacked artwork this one is much different, it's not made of steel, but paper. The houses are stacked up way into the sky and they look like they might tumble later.

6. This painting looks like a dreary day, clouds full of rain and grass with a sway. The wires in front hold up strange shapes like houses or sheet ghosts or triangular capes.
